On 5th October, Mrs Betty and Enterprise
Ambassadors were invited to launch The National
Enterprise Challenge (TNEC) 2016 at the Houses of
Parliament with Theo Pathitis and former Shadow
Education Secretary, Tristram Hunt.

Mrs Betty delivered a presentation on the schools view of the challenge and accepted the award of 'Most Enterprising Teacher 2015'. She accepted the award of behalf of all the Enterprising students from Northampton Academy, stating they are within the 16% of students identified by the Careers and Enterprise Company as having the enterprising skills needed in today's challenging world.





Northampton Academy has been a part of The National Enterprise Challenge since it launched in 2013. The challenge was started by two cousins Michael and Ben Dyer whose motivation for the project was to inspire the next generation to improve their enterprise and employability skills. They formed the Youth Enterprise Community Interest Company (CIC) and the flagship TNEC with Lord Sugar fronting the project and initially working with 58 schools nationwide in the first year.

At the 2015 National Finals day at Alton Towers this Summer, the Year 8 and Year 10 teams from Northampton Academy did exceptionally well. The Year 10 delivered a fantastic presentation on their 'Worlds End Ride' which put them in 2nd place, competing against over 30,000 students from across the country. Rudra Patel took the title of 'Most Enterprising Boy— Key Stage 3'.

The 2016 Challenge

In October the new challenges were set for 2016 over a two day workshop. The Year 8 challenge was to come up with an outdoor learning activity and Year 10 had to come up with a school based business. The two teams will go onto the finals at Kingswood Activity Centre in the Summer.
